Executive Order 207: Breaking It Down

In preparation for the arrival of COVID-19 vaccines to New Jersey, Governor Murphy signed <u>Executive Order 207</u> which automatically enrolls residents **who choose to receive the COVID-19 vaccine** into the state's existing vaccine registry.

The New Jersey Immunization Information System (NJIIS)

provides current recommended immunization schedules for all ages and consolidates immunization information from all providers into one record. NJIIS assists state and federal agencies with population assessments in the event of a preventable disease outbreak and helps communities assess their immunization coverage.

Currently, all individuals born on or after January 1, 1998 are automatically enrolled in the registry unless they opt-out of the registry. Any individual born prior to January 1, 1998 can elect to opt-in. The Governor's Executive Order changes inclusion from an opt-in to an opt-out program for residents who elect to receive a COVID-19 vaccine. That group of residents will be automatically enrolled into the system and will then be permitted to opt-out of the registry 30 days after the public health emergency expires. <u>This change does not force persons to receive the vaccine.</u> **Here are some example scenarios:**

- Jake (born 3/12/00 When Jake was born, he was enrolled in NJIIS. When the COVID-19 vaccine becomes available, Jake decides to get vaccinated. Because he chose to get the vaccine, Jake's information in NJIIS is updated with the COVID-19 vaccine along with his other past immunizations.
- Sarah (born 6/12/90) Sarah was born prior to 1998 so when she was born, her parents opted to register her in NJIIS. Sarah decided she does not want to get vaccinated against COVID-19. She has an NJIIS record from childhood but with no COVID-19 vaccine recorded.
- Alexandra (born 4/1/97) Alexandra was born prior to 1998 and her parents opted not to register her in NJIIS. She decides to get vaccinated for COVID-19 which opts her into NJIIS. 30 days after the Public Health emergency is lifted, Alexandra decides to opt out of NJIIS.

Morris County At Home Testing

Morris County is now offering free at-home COVID-19 saliva and nasal testing at no cost to people who want to be tested.

- Only Morris County residents and people who work in Morris County are eligible.
- If you work in Morris County but don't live there, you must submit proof of employment.
- You will be asked for health insurance information, but you will not be billed.
- Due to limited supplies, individuals will be limited to two tests per month.

NJ Travel Advisories

- New Jersey strongly discourages all non-essential interstate travel at this time.
- Travelers and residents returning from **any US state or territory** beyond the immediate region (NY, CT, PA and DE) should self-quarantine at their home.
- If travel is unavoidable should consider getting tested with a viral test 1-3 days before the trip and again 3-5 days after the trip.
- If travelers test <u>positive</u>, they should **self-isolate for** at least 10 days and should postpone travel.
- If travelers test <u>negative</u>, they should **quarantine for** a full 7 days after travel.
- If testing is <u>not available</u>, travelers should **quarantine for 10 days after travel.**
