- strong to severe storms expected thru the weekend.
- **Round 1:** Late tonight into early Friday.
 - Will monitor how far east a weakening line of storms progresses into our area overnight.
- - Right now, there is a low potential and conditional risk.
- overnight hours.
 - Threat is for all areas, but greatest for areas along/north of I-10/12.
- introducing cooler temps mid/late week and into next weekend.
 - Will monitor potential for freezing temps for northern areas Friday morning Sun morning.

Round 2: Low chance of re-development for eastern areas Friday morning and afternoon.


Round 3: A more potent system and greater conditional risk primarily Saturday evening into the

Drying out Sunday into next week, but another quick-moving front swings through Tuesday










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Friday into Friday Night



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Storms continue to weaken early Friday along the main line, but some re-development could be possible across coastal MS Friday morning into the afternoon.


Elsewhere, most areas expected to be dry.

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- Most of the day primarily dry, but can't rule out a passing shower or storm in the afternoon.
- Main activity organizes to the west, and slides through Saturday evening/night.
- At this time, threat is greatest mainly for areas along/north of I-10/12.











Saturday into Saturday Night. Threat Timing Primarily Saturday Evening into Overnight




