Changes since Previous Update:

- Confidence continues to increase that there will be moderate to major impacts from winter weather Tuesday thru Tuesday Night.
- No additional changes to headlines from this morning's update.

Overview:

Cold Weather:

- Confidence is very high that we will see excessively cold temperatures Monday Morning through Thursday morning, with dangerous wind chills in the teens to single digits expected.
- A Cold Weather Advisory is in effect for Sunday Night/Monday Morning, also Monday Night/Tuesday Morning. Additional headlines are expected.
- Slight warming trend in temperatures are expected Friday into next weekend.

Winter Weather:


- Confidence has increased that we will likely see impacts from snow and/or snow/ice mix primarily Tuesday morning through Tuesday evening/early parts of the night for most of SE LA and southern MS.
- Impacts to travel are expected, which will likely last into the day on Wednesday and could even last into early Thursday for some areas.




Monday: Forecast Low Temps and Wind Chills

Minimum Wind Chill







Monday: Hours Below Freezing and Hours 25°F or Lower

Hours Below Freezing 12AM Mon – 12AM Tue




Hours 25°F or Lower 12AM Mon – 12AM Tue





Cold Weather Advisory In Effect

In effect Sunday Night/Monday Morning & Monday Night/Tuesday Morning



Cold Weather Advisory in effect:

- What: Very cold wind chills expected this week. Southwest Mississippi and adjacent Louisiana Parishes should see wind chills 10 to 15 degrees. The I-10/12 corridors and points south can expect wind chills 15 to 25 degrees.
- Where: All of SE LA and southern MS
- When: In effect 6PM Sunday 9AM Monday, again 9PM Monday 6PM Tuesday

Precautionary/Preparedness Actions:

- Wear appropriate clothing, hat, gloves.
- Keep pets indoors as much as possible.
 Make sure outdoor animals have a warm, dry shelter, food and unfrozen water
- Make frequent checks on older family, friends and neighbors. Ensure portable heaters are used correctly.




Tuesday: Forecast Low Temps and Wind Chills

Minimum Wind Chill








Hours 25°F or Lower 12AM Tue – 12AM Wed







Wednesday: Forecast Low Temps and Wind Chills

Minimum Wind Chill








Hours 25°F or Lower 12AM Wed – 12AM Thu








Note: Light winds will result in wind chills near the air temperature.


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

Hours Below Freezing 12AM Thu – 12AM Fri





Winter Storm Watch In Effect

In effect late Monday night into Tuesday evening.



Winter Storm Watch in effect:

- What: Winter precipitation causing moderate to major impacts is expected. Snow accumulations of 4 to 6 inches along and north of the I-10/12 corridor and 1 to 3 inches south of this corridor. There is also a low chance of ice accumulations along and south of I-10/12
- Where: All of SE LA, excluding the immediate SE LA coast and southern MS
- When: In effect late Monday night through Tuesday evening.


Impacts:

 Roads, especially bridges and overpasses, will likely become slick and hazardous. Plan on slippery road conditions. The hazardous conditions could impact the Tuesday morning and evening commutes.

WEATHER STATE

Probability of > 1" Snow Accumulation

Valid from 6AM Monday through 6AM Wednesday



What Has Changed:

- Probabilities continue to increase, with greater confidence for impacts across most of SE LA and southern MS.
- Probabilities are high (70-90%) that at least moderate impacts from accumulating snow will occur.
- Moderate to major impacts are anticipated, especially to travel from late Monday through Wednesday and could extend into early Thursday.

Valid from 6AM Monday through 6AM Wednesday



What Has Changed:


 Forecast snowfall totals have increased since yesterday.
 Additional changes in forecast snowfall totals are likely.

- Represents the 50/50 chance of occurrence.
- Moderate to major impacts are anticipated, especially to travel from late Monday through Wednesday and could extend into early Thursday.



Reasonable Worst Case Snow Amount

Valid from 6AM Monday through 6AM Wednesday



What Has Changed:


High-end (10% chance)
 forecast snowfall totals have
 increased since yesterday.

- Represents values with only a 10% chance of being exceeded.
- Moderate to major impacts are anticipated, especially to travel from late Monday through Wednesday and could extend into early Thursday.



Probability of > 0.01" Ice Accumulation

Valid from 6AM Monday through 6AM Wednesday



What Has Changed:

- Probabilities have increased slightly across mainly southern/coastal LA.
- Main concern will be along and generally south of the I-10 corridor, specifically over the Atchafalaya basin.
- Despite higher probabilities, total accumulation is still forecast less than 0.10".
- There is some concern for minor impacts caused by accumulating ice in these locations.
