




Winter Storm Expected Tonight through Saturday

Decision Support Briefing #4 As of 5 AM Friday, January 28, 2022

What Has Changed?

- Winter Storm Watch upgraded to a Blizzard Warning along the coast
- ✓ Winter Storm Watch upgraded to a Winter Storm Warning inland
- ✓ Winter Weather Advisory for parts of SE PA and NW NJ
- Gale Warning upgraded to Storm Warning on the waters off the northern coast of NJ
- ✓ Coastal Flood Advisory
- ✓ Wind Chill Advisory for the Poconos













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Main Points

Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing
Blizzard	Blizzard conditions with wind gusts as high as 50 MPH and snow totals of 8 to 15 inches. Strong winds resulting in blowing and drifting snow and very low visibility. Travel is discouraged. Power outages are possible.	The coastal counties of New Jersey and the Delaware Beaches	Tonight and Saturday
Snow and Heavy Snow	Accumulating snow will create hazardous travel conditions. Blowing and drifting snow is possible.	Southeastern Pennsylvania, New Jersey (except the coastal counties), Delaware (except the beaches), and part of eastern Maryland	Tonight and Saturday
Coastal Flooding	Widespread minor coastal flooding is expected with roadway flooding likely.	The coasts of New Jersey and Delaware	Saturday morning
Wind Chill	Dangerous wind chill values as low as 20 below zero.	The Pocono Region of Pennsylvania	Saturday night and Sunday morning
Marine	Gale to storm force wind gusts are expected along with freezing spray.	The Atlantic coastal waters of New Jersey and Delaware, and Delaware Bay	Tonight through Saturday night

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








Latest Snow Total Forecast

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


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Coastal Flooding



 A Coastal Flood Advisory is in effect from 3:00 AM until 9:00 AM Saturday.

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- The advisory includes tidal areas in the counties of Ocean NJ, SE Burlington NJ, Atlantic NJ, Cape May NJ and Sussex DE.
- Widespread minor tidal flooding is expected in the advisory area.

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




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Wind and Wind Chill

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Event Summary

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- A winter storm is forecast to affect much of the region tonight and Saturday. A sharp gradient to lower snowfall amounts is anticipated near or just northwest of the I-95 Corridor.
- Blizzard conditions are expected near the coast with strong wind gusts, reduced visibility and snowfall of 8 to 15 inches. Northerly wind 30 to 40 MPH with gusts around 50 MPH.
- Heavy snow is anticipated at least as far inland as the I-95 Corridor with amounts generally 4 to 10 inches. Northerly wind 20 to 30 MPH with gusts around 40 MPH.
- ✓ Gale to storm force wind gusts on the coastal waters of New Jersey and Delaware.
- Minor coastal flooding is expected on Saturday morning along the coasts of New Jersey and Delaware.
- Dangerous wind chill values on Saturday night and Sunday morning, especially in the Poconos.










